We artists and cultural workers of the University of the Philippines at Diliman strongly take exception to how the National Artists were named this year.

irst, the spirit of the process was not upheld in the final selection of the awardees. We concede that any subjective decision of this nature gives rise to a range of diverse views. What we cannot accept is the corruption of this already fraught process. The art community judiciously took part in this exercise, with the hope that an evenhanded process would produce truly worthy National Artists. This good faith in government has been subverted. It has made us distrust any effort to involve us in what may ultimately turn out to be a charade, or a farce in fact, and to regard the cultural bureaucracy as helplessly beholden to the contrivances of politicians and their courtiers.

Second, there was a demonstration of significant indiscretion, or even egregious imprudence, on the part of the officials who administered the awards. It was totally amiss—unethical, dishonest, morally bereft, and abusive—that those who oversaw the process ended up being honored and reaping the gains of their own auspice. We, therefore, deplore the utter contempt for the vital value of fairness in favor of personal ambitions of Sicilian proportions.

In light of these sentiments, we call for the immediate review of the law governing the National Artist awards and the rules that carry it out. We are specifically concerned about the power of the President, acting as a patron, to supersede the judgment of art's public sphere and the unbecoming conduct

of those in the civil service who are sworn to transcend conflicts of interest and defend democratic ideals.

Finally, as members of the community of scholars, we demand and expect the full commitment to integrity, excellence, and the tireless toil for the greater good.

National Artists deserve a process equal to their stature.

The exhibition, jointly curated by Prof. Rubén D.F. Defeo and Dr. Patrick D. Flores of the Department of Art Studies of the College of Arts and Letters, runs until December 31.

Like Bulwagan ng Dangal, the exhibition's title is taken from the University hymn and speaks of the possibility of change that animates a forever expectant nation and people.

"In keeping with this spirit," Flores writes in the commemorative brochure, "the exhibition reveals the strength of the UP trove in the realms of commemorative public art, from portraiture to monumental sculpture. As these points try to mark turning points in the triumph of culture and consciousness, so do other expressions to mark watersheds with a more fearless temper; social realism and abstraction offer equally compelling visions of critique and

whimsy, further inflecting the legacy of the University with urgency and imagination."

The exhibition, Flores further elaborates, "is a broad survey of pieces in the collection that affirms the standards of the canon of Philippine art history, duly citing the stature of 'masters' like Amorsolo and Tolentino and their works done in the habits of the academy, totems that have been ensconced in the order of things. At another, it is a disruption of this rhythm, a syncopation as it were generated by pieces that go against the beat of this custom and consequently measure an uncanny interval, testifying to the flux of the aesthetic in the milieu. And so, while there may be a semblance of posterity ingrained in busts and heroic paintings, there are around this fraught

veneration traces of commentary about how, for instance, repression and social inequity have shaped other bodies and sentiments, a conflicting vision of the classical proportion or the pose of well being. Also, there are intimations of fantasy, a prefiguration of an 'always incipient cosmos' lying outside quotidian reckoning but springing nevertheless from the intuition of a finite human agent constrained by material condition. Here, there is play, speculation, reverie, and flight that is necessary to transform a world that has fallen apart. The collection is faithful to a committed and dreaming University."

The exhibit is a centennial project of the UPD Office of the Chancellor through the Office for Initiatives in Culture and the Arts.

Bisyon: Itaguyod ang wikang Filipino bilang midyum ng pagtuturo, pananaliksik, at publikasyon, at opisyal na komunikasyon ayon sa probisyon sa wika ng Konstitusyong 1987.

Misyon: Tumulong sa implementasyon ng Palisi sa Wika ng UP.

Marami nang nailathalang aklat at kagamitang pampagtuturo, nagawang mga palihan o workshop, seminar, at kongreso ang UP SWF hinggil sa usaping pangwika. Ang programang ito ay isa sa mga gawaing ipinatutupad ni Dr. Jovy M. Peregrino, ang kasalukuyang direktor ng SWF bilang bahagi ng kanyang programang lubusang mailapit ang wikang Filipino at maipakilala ang SWF sa mga kolehiyo at opisina ng UP Diliman upang makagawa ng mga multidisiplinaryo at interdisiplinaryong proyektong maaring magkatuwang na mabuo ng mga kolehiyo at ng SWF para sa lalong pag-unlad at pagsulong ng wikang Filipino sa akademya.
