





Ferrer was a Visiting Professor donesia (October 2002)

She was a fellow at the Solomon Asch Center for the Study of Ethnic Conflicts, University of Pennsylvania (Summer 2005); Early Warning and Conflict Prevention, UN Staff College (December 199); Advanced International Programme on Peace and Conflict Studies, Uppsala University, Sweden (Summer 1992); United Nations University and UP Center for Integrative and Development Studies Regional Training Seminar on Domestic Conflict Resolution in Asia, Quezon City (November 1991); and the Poetry Fellow, Silliman University, Dum-

aguete (Summer 1989). A weekly columnist of Eyes See, the online news of ABS-CBN, she has written various articles on the Philippine peace process, the communist insurgency and Moro separatism, peace-building, civil society, and Southeast Asian politics. Her works appeared in inter-

cum laude, from UP in 1980, and her MA in Southeast Asian Studies from University of Kent at Canterbury in 1991.



Rep. Satur C. Ocampo, a key opposition figure, is the House Deputy Minority Leader and Bayan Muna representative.

Born to a family of tenant farmers in Sta. Rita Pampanga on April 7, 1939. Ocampo supported himself through university education. In the developing political ferment in the 1960s, he gained a comprehensive grasp of the country's problems as well as its history of struggle for genuine freedom.

In 1963, he joined the as a full-time journalist. He covered the business beat until the newspaper was shut down in 1972. Ocampo was also the vice president of the National Press Club (NPC) from 1970 to 1972.

A founding member of the militant organization Kabataang Makabayan, Ocampo co-founded the National Democratic Front (NDF) which sought to unite various anti-dictatorship forces in1973.

Hunted by the military, he was arrested in 1976. In 1985, while on "pass" to vote at the NPC annual elections. he eluded his guards and rejoined the underground revolutionary movement.

In 1986, when President Corazón C. Aquino called for peace talks with the NDF, Ocampo headed the group's negotiating panel. He returned to the underground movement when the peace talks collapsed in 1987. He was arrested with his wife, Carolina "Bobbie" Malay in 1989. Ocampo was granted freedom in 1992, a year after his wife was released.

In 1999, Ocampo was elected president of Bayan Muna. He was the party's leading candidate in its first venture into electoral politics in the May 2001 party-list election.

During the 13th Congress, Ocampo chaired the House Special Committee on Peace, Unity and Reconciliation. He was also the vice chairperson of the Human Rights Committee.




Prof. José V. Abueva has been a Professor Emeritus of Political Science and Public Administration at UP Diliman since 1998. He served as UP President from 1987 to 1993 and as Chancellor of UPD from 1990 to 1991. He is also the founder and current president of Kalayaan College.

Abueva was a Visiting Professor of Political Science at the Brooklyn College of the City University of New York from 1966 to 1967, and at the Yale University, New Haven, Connecticut from 1969 to 1970. He was also invited as a quest lecturer at the University of Michigan, Cornell University, the University of Hawaii, University of California in Berkeley, University of Tokyo, and Kyoto University of Foreign Studies.

A Ten Outstanding Young Men awardee for political science in 1962, Abueva wrote extensively on Philippine socio-political thought and constitutional reform. He served as secretary of the 1971 Constitutional Convention, executive director of the Legislative-Executive Local Government Reform Commission, and chairman of the Legislative-Executive Bases Council that laid the blueprint for the bases conversion program in 1990. Abueva also chaired the Consultative Commission formed by President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo in 2005 which came up with a draft constitution that called for a unicameral parliament.

A prolific writer, Abueva has written a number of books including Ang Filipino sa Siglo 21 (Filipino, The National Language into the 21st Century) and Towards a Federal Republic of the Philippines with a Parliamentary Government. He has also edited numerous publications, foremost among which is the 20-volume PAMANA: The UP Anthology of Filipino Socio-Political Thought Since 1872.

Abueva earned his AB Arts-Law. cum laude, from UP in 1951, his Master of Public Administration and Ph.D. in Political Science/Sociology from the University of Michigan, USA in 1954 and 1959 respectively.

WORKSHOP

July 7: , 8:30-11:30 a.m./2:30-5:30 p.m., Tolentino Hall, College of Fine Arts (CFA). A series of two 6-week workshops offering instruction in the fundamentals of ceramic materials and their formal manipulation for the expressive creation of ceramic art objects in a cooperative studio environment is structured with activities for up to twenty participants per workshop. It includes lectures illustrating historical influences on contemporary ceramic art, demonstrations of ceramic techniques for sculptural and design work, supervision approaches for studio practice in ceramics, and evaluation of creative activity through group critiques.

Prof. Rita Badilla-Gudiño of CFA coordinates workshop activities with Visiting Fulbright Scholar Tom Decker. Together they implement materials, resources and facilities required for instructional content. The first of the series of workshop is open to all CFA faculty. The second batch is open to students and staff of CFA and is extended to the academic community as a whole.

Workshop participants meet as a group once a week on Mondays from 8:30-11:30 a.m. and/or 2:30-5:30 p.m. The studio setting may be accessible during regular hours of campus operation throughout the week for participants to continue working on an individual basis. Participants may subscribe for a single six-week workshop or re-subscribe for another six weeks.

This series of workshops is intended to stimulate a crossdisciplinary interest in the studio practice of ceramics. Building interest in the study of ceramic art across Visual Communication, Studio Arts, Industrial Design, Art Theory, Graduate Program, RGEP, Continuing Education and Summer Programs aids the development of future curricula and may broaden the scope of existing course offerings.


The culminating activity is an exhibit of the participants' output during the workshop.

UP hosts UAAP

n celebration of the centenary of the University of the Philippines (UP), UP is hosting the 71st season of the University Athletic Association of the Philippines (UAAP) for school year 2008-2009, with a theme "Filipino Leadership through Sports Excellence."

UP is one of the three universities, together with the De La Salle University (DLSU) and University of Santo Tomas (UST), competing in all the events namely, for 1st semester events: Basketball (Men and Women), Beach Volleyball (Men & Women), Chess (Men & Women), Judo (Men & Women), Swimming (Men & Women), Table Tennis (Men & Women), Taekwondo (Men & Women).

For 2nd semester events: Baseball, Badminton (Men & Women), Fencing (Men & Women), Football (Men & Women), Softball, Tennis (Men & Women), Track & Field (Men & Women), and Volleyball (Men

The last time UP hosted the UAAP games was during its 62nd Season in 1999-2000. The first time UP hosted was in 1949-1950 season. So far, UP has hosted the event 10 times, with the centennial hosting, the 11th.

UP won the general championship during the 60th season in 1997-1998, and has been overall champion five times, one of them was a tie with the perennial champion UST during the 1982-1983 season.

As host, UP will preside over the opening ceremonies on July 5 at the Araneta Coliseum with a spectacle.

The UAAP started in 1930 as a triangular meet between the National University, UP and UST. The "Big 3," as it was called, signed an agreement where to experiment with a home to home format wherein games were played at the three campuses. The three universities were then members of the National Collegiate Athletic

The triangular meet became a success and on April 6, 1932 the three renewed their agreement. The "Big 3" then seceded from the NCAA and continued for the next six years. On September 27, 1938, representatives of the three universities together with the Far Eastern University, which was already dominating the sports scene at

that time, formally organized the UAAP. The first sports events were basketball, women's volleyball, baseball,

football, swimming and track and field. To encourage greater competition, the University of the East (UE), Adamson University (ADU), University of Manila, and the Manila Central University were admitted to the association in 1952. Of the four applicants, only ADU and UE attained permanent status. Ateneo de Manila University and DLSU were admitted to UAAP in 1978 and 1986, respectively.

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
